

### **Recipe of the Month**

#### *Swirled Pumpkin Cream Cheese Bars*

##### Ingredients

6 TBSP butter, melted and cooled  
1  $\frac{3}{4}$  c sugar  
3 eggs  
1 can pumpkin  
1  $\frac{3}{4}$  c flour  
1  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp cinnamon  
1 tsp soda  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp baking powder  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp nutmeg  
1 package (8 oz.) cream cheese (room temp)

Cream butter and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  c of sugar.

Add 2 eggs, pumpkin, and 1/3 c water. Beat till blended.

In another bowl, mix flour, cinnamon, baking soda, baking powder and nutmeg. Stir into butter mixture then spread evenly into a buttered and floured 10X15 in. baking pan.

In separate bowl, beat cream cheese, remaining egg and remaining  $\frac{1}{4}$  c sugar. Drop into batter in 24 evenly spaced 1 TBSP portions. Pull a knife tip through filling to swirl slightly into batter.

Bake at 350 for 30 minutes. Let cool and then cut into 24 bars.

Refrigerate for up to 3 days.

### **Road Trip of the Month**

#### ***La Sal Del Rey***

(Translation King's Salt) One of 3 naturally occurring salt lakes in South Texas and estimated to be 7X saltier than the ocean. Located 51 miles south from our park you will find a wonderful place for hiking and birding. Wildlife enthusiasts will find plenty to see in this US Fish and Wildlife Service Wildlife Refuge. Migrating geese, ducks, shorebirds and sandhill cranes as well as wintering long-billed curlew.

Directions – Head south on 281 for 47 miles. Exit onto TX-186 and head east for 3.6 miles to the kiosk on the north side of the road.

### **RV Tech Tip of the Month – Oven Heat Distribution**

RV ovens are notorious for uneven and often burnt cooking, but placing pans/food on a pizza stone, or a thick, unglazed ceramic tile, before sliding it into the oven to bake, can work wonders in helping heat to distribute better. (Be sure to let the ceramic cool fully before cleaning, as a hot stone immersed in water can shatter quite dramatically).
